



**CITY OF STUART, FLORIDA
DECLARATION OF STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY
(COVID-19 State of Emergency)**

WHEREAS, Section 16-4 of the City of Stuart, Code of Ordinances authorizes the Mayor to declare a State of Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has determined that a State of Local Emergency exists within the City of Stuart, Florida; and

WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and other potential methods, and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza; and

WHEREAS, in December of 2019, a new and substantial outbreak of COVID-19 emerged in Wuhan, China, and has since spread rapidly to more than 117 Countries and territories throughout the World including the United States, and more specifically several locations within the State of Florida;

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-51, declaring that appropriate measures to control the spread of COVID-19 in the State of Florida are necessary, and therefore directed that a Public Health Emergency be declared in the State of Florida. Further the Governor issued a statement recommending that local municipalities and private entities strongly consider limiting or postponing mass gatherings in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-52, declaring a State of Emergency in the State of Florida regarding the COVID-19 pandemic. The Governor's Declaration of Emergency has been extended several times and remains in full force and effect; and

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2020, there were over five (5) million cases of the Coronavirus identified in the United States in excess of One Hundred and Sixty-Three Thousand (163,000) deaths. On March 16, 2020, when the City of Stuart declared the initial state of emergency related to Covid 19, there existed 142,539 confirmed cases of COVID-19 globally, and in excess of 5,393

deaths. There now exists more deaths in the United States than there were global cases of Covid 19 when this emergency began; and

WHEREAS, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) prediction that it is was likely that widespread transmission of COVID-19 will occur throughout the United States was accurate. The public health threat posed by COVID-19 continues to be “high”, both in the United States and throughout the world; the CDC has advised that older adults and persons with serious chronic medical conditions are at a higher risk of severe illness caused from exposure to COVID-19, and should take extra precautions to avoid exposure and further transmission; and

WHEREAS, no vaccine or drug is currently available to cure or combat COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the City of Stuart, Florida is threatened by COVID-19 because of the apparent ability of the virus to spread rapidly among humans, and COVID-19 thereby constitutes a clear and present threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens and visitors of the City of Stuart, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the City of Stuart should take protective measures – including activation of the emergency operations center at such time as deemed necessary by the City Manager; procurement of personal protective equipment; consequence management, and similar activities to support the public health and safety of the community; and

WHEREAS, the City of Stuart Code of Ordinances authorizes the Mayor to declare a State of Local Emergency which in turn empowers the City Commission, City Manager and other Staff to waive the procedures and formalities otherwise required by law pertaining to:

1. Make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by such emergency’ provided, however, such rules and regulations must be confirmed at the earliest practicable time by the City Commission;
2. Obtain vital supplies, equipment, and such other properties found lacking and needed for the protection of life and property and bind the City for the fair value thereof and, if required immediately, commandeer the same for public use;
3. Require emergency service of any City officer or employee and command the aid of as many citizens of this community as is deemed necessary in the execution of its duties; such persons shall be entitled to all privileges, benefits, and immunities as are provided by state law for registered disaster service workers;
4. Performance of public works and those actions necessary to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the community, including but not limited to denying or

revoking permits for public gatherings and/or cancelling mass gatherings taking place during the Local State of Emergency.

5. Entering into contracts; Incurring obligations; Rental of equipment; Acquisition and distribution, with or without compensation, of supplies, materials and facilities; Appropriation and expenditure of public funds.


NOW, THEREFORE,
