Discuss and finalize a FY 2018 Five Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) **Summary Explanation/Background Information on Agenda Request:**

As a result of the Martin County Board of County Commissioners decision to place a referendum on the ballot for August 29, 2017, to consider a One Cent Infrastructure Sales Surtax, the city commission voted at its June 26, 2017 Regular Meeting to hold a workshop on July 10, 2017, to discuss its possible strategy to educate the public as to the impact of the 1 Cent Sales Surtax on the City.

In particular, the Five Year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to be adopted in conjunction with the FY2017-2018 Annual Budget was designed to accommodate a possible election and approval of the 1 Cent Sales Surtax.

When this matter was first put to a vote in 2015, the City was successful in educating the public, such that they (all City precincts) voted to approve the tax, even though the measure failed countywide. Part of the discussion is to consider the prioritization of projects to be implemented if the tax is approved.

Attached is a suggested CIP categorized as priorities B and C. As you may remember, Category A items are already included in the proposed 2017-2018 budget, and don't need to be considered further, but Category B and C items are shown in outlying years, because funding had not yet been identified.
